The committee shared this with DNA-RAG and Disaster Aid USA (members of the committee share membership in DNA-RAG and Disaster Aid). The guide is a product of the Zones – it has not been submitted to RI and no approval by RI has been sought or issued. It is an outstanding product of committed Rotarians within the Zones for use within their areas but can be shared and used by other Rotarians in other Zones\Districts as an example of topics to be addressed and potential structures that might be set up. We extend our appreciation for their willingness to share the product of their hard work.
